### Around the Coyote...how the BCO is helping

You have probably heard of the festival, but perhaps you didn't realize the impact Around the Coyote is making as educators of the arts. Please read their attached mission statement. I think we all should be proud that not only can we help to support ATC, but that we are part of a community that values the arts and education

*Since 2000, Around the Coyote has developed progressive Education Outreach programs to teach and to stimulate artistic expression in children and adults of all ages in the Wicker Park and Bucktown neighborhoods of Chicago, IL. Our education philosophy is founded upon the idea that every member of the community can and should have access to art education. Utilizing an interdisciplinary approach to art making, Around the Coyote works with established and emerging artists as instructors and role models to introduce students to art theory and practice. Our workshops and courses for youth provide creative, collaborative art activities in a positive, nurturing environment where open dialogue and individual expression are encouraged. Programs for adults create opportunities for personal and artistic growth for artists of all skill and age levels. The goal of our programming is to inspire new art-makers, critical thinkers, and active community members who will create shared and lasting experiences which connect our participants to their lives, to each other, and to their own creative potential.*

### Gallery Updates

#### Johnsonese Gallery "Phoenix"

*Phoenix* celebrates our rising from the ashes of our old underground space, to a bigger, better--and most importantly main level--location! This show is a tribute to re-birth with bold works and strong colors. Think fireworks on canvas. The show features six emerging artists: Joey Wozniak, Elizabeth Tyson, Joseph Innocenti, Doug Goessman, John Gibbs and Wade Chandler.

Plus, Johnsonese Gallery has added **New Orleans artist David Harouni** to *Phoenix*! Talk about re-birth--David has sent us new paintings from his temporary studio in Florida. David has lived in Iran, Israel, Mexico, New York, and--until Katrina--New Orleans. His work reflects this complex past.

## Around the Coyote Gallery "Reclamation"

Around the Coyote is bringing Los Angeles to Chicago with the first major Midwest exhibition of Laura Ricci's acrylic landscapes and architectural drawings. In the shiny, gritty, post-modern frontier that is LA, where everything is impermanent and unsustainable, Ricci deals with living on the brink by dreaming of the day when nature will begin to reclaim it all. Her paintings layer architecture with landscape, reality with the daydream, in a manner that is more honest than hallucinatory, more tactile than picturesque.

A Midwestern woman living in LA can't help but be affected by its highway culture. For Ricci, LA is the lack of connectedness felt in the Midwestern suburbs compounded. While sitting in her car on the daily commutes that are de rigueur in LA **the blueprint work**, one of two elements of the *Reclamation* show, began to take shape. "The lack of physical connection with the places I pass through leaves me with a desire to turn them into still, real images," Ricci said.

Ricci's **wood floor paintings**, the second element of the Reclamation series, combine her blueprint drawings with acrylic landscapes. About this work Ricci said, "The wood floor paintings begin to tell a story about Nature and her inanimate denizens reclaiming their environments. Nurturing my desire toward anthropomorphism, I wonder what happens when the trees have had enough and the gallery floors are sick of the white walls?... In these pieces I visit places where mankind's rules are superseded and the landscape takes over."

Around the Coyote Gallery is located at 1935 1/2 W. North Avenue. Reclamation runs from Oct 28-Nov 23

## Planning and Zoning News

On October 13, several BCO Zoning and Planning Committee members attended a meeting with Alderman Matlak to discuss the relationship between the BCO and his office as it relates to zoning and planning matters. Previously, we had been concerned that zoning changes were being made without community input. We also invited other 32nd Ward groups to join us and Wicker Park, Roscoe Village and Sheffield all joined.

Alderman Matlak agreed that the involvement of strong community groups makes our neighborhood a better place and we jointly agreed that the Alderman would direct all requests to change the zoning of a property to the respective community group for comment. In return, we agreed that we would hear all proposals in a timely manner and ensure that all decisions would be reasonably made. We also talked about how to best make communication smooth between the Alderman's office and the various community groups.

Overall it was a very positive meeting and we are all looking forward to working more closely with Alderman Matlak.

We are also asking that you notify the Zoning and Planning Committee if you either notice postings in the neighborhood stating that an application for a zoning change has been made or if you receive a letter stating that a property owner is seeking a zoning change.

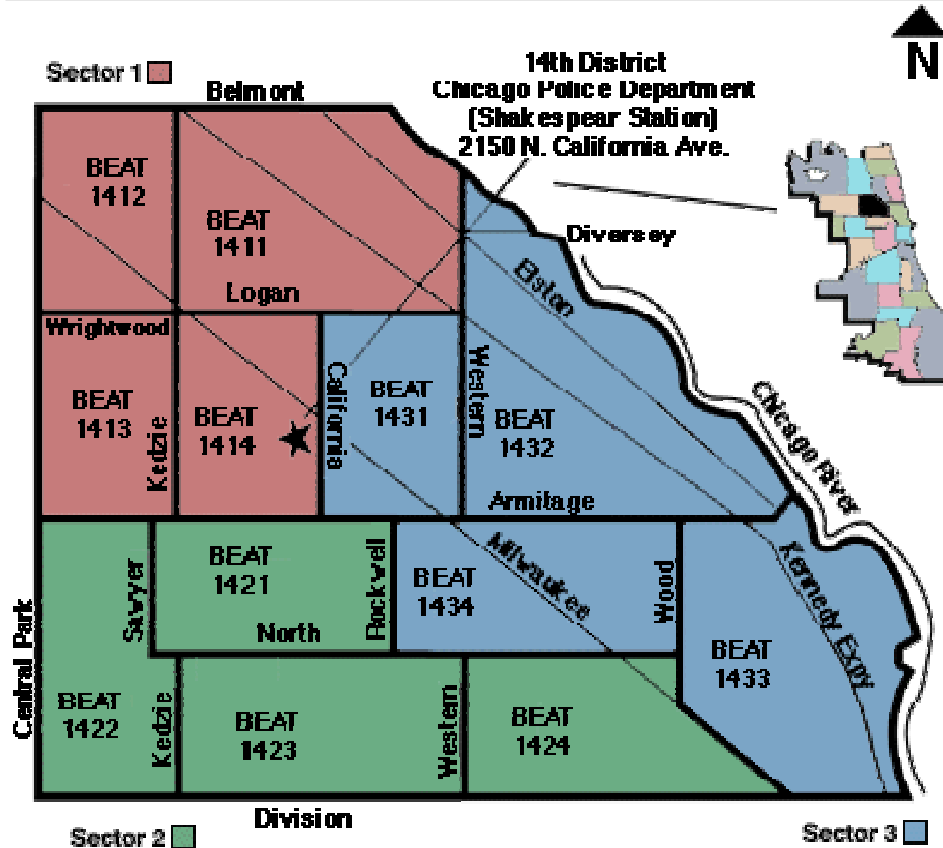
